I have noticed the newspaper stories to the effect that young Amon has probably been captured on the Tunisian Front, and I want you to know that you have my sincere sympathy. From the newspaper accounts it appears that our casualties were light, though our loss in prisoners was fairly heavy, and, of course I sincerely hope that he was not injured, though being a prisoner is no bed of roses.

It is things like this that bring the seriousness of this war home to us and I am afraid we will have a good deal more of it before it is over.

I sincerely hope that you soon get word that he is well and uninjured.

I am also joined in this message by Nancy. You always were one of her favorites and just lately she has been cashing in some coupons on a Fort Worth Club bond that you gave her several years ago.
