Gentlemen:

Your letter of March 17 making inquiry about Lieut. Amon G. Carter, Jr. has been received and I wish I could give you more information, however all we have is Mr. Carter's telegram from the War Department merely stating that Amon Jr. had been reported missing in action in the North African Area as of February 14 and if further information was secured they will be glad to notify him.

An Associated Press story from Africa mentioned that Amon was on a forward observation post in the Lessousda Hills and was believed to have been captured by the Germans. So it seems our next information, if he is a prisoner, will come from the Red Cross if, as, and when Italy or Germany feels disposed to release the prisoner list to the Red Cross through Switzerland.
