a prisoner in Germany, and she has
heard from him several times.

I have just written Bruce
about Aude because I know he'd
want to know. He adores Aude
so very much, and felt very badly
about her.

I have had very little news

recently which was surprising right now, his wife last heard from Bruce was June and in good spirits.

Did you meet Capt. Browne when you were with the Battalion? He was S.C. of "A" Btry. He was wounded, decorated and promoted in February, only to be taken prisoner while on his way to the base hospital in an ambulance. Fortunately, his wound was in two sections - a leg injury, but they are very anxious about him, because they have had no further news of him; just that a Nazi pilot took the ambulance away from Browne.

Thank you again for sending the clippings. I appreciate it very much.
