Dear Mr. Carter:

Although I do not know you personally, nor have I been privileged to meet you since coming to Fort Worth, yet I am writing you to express my sincere gratitude concerning the ~~news~~ ^{news} that has come relative to your son. Although I regret that he is a prisoner in the hands of the Germans, yet I rejoice to know with you and thousands of others that your son is alive. I cherish with you your prospects of your seeing him and having him with you again.

Upon leaving Raleigh I went by to see a friend of yours, namely, Editor Josephus Daniels, of The News and Observer. He spoke kindly of you concerning the large place you occupy in the affairs of Fort Worth and of the Southwest. He indicated that your influence in civic affairs was very pronounced. At that time he asked me to bear greetings to you.

This letter will not require any answer. I simply wanted you to know that being a father myself I rejoice with you that your noble son is alive. You may be interested to know that in staff meetings of the workers of the church, those who know you in the staff have prayed that this might be the outcome, namely, that your son was still alive and that he might in the days ahead be permitted to come back home.
