I regret to have missed you in passing through your City a week past, but was glad to get the information from your Secretary regarding the general setup of things.

May I state further to you that not only our family have constantly found an interest in your son, Amon Jr., but so many of our friends here have called us and mentioned to us of hearing of your good news.

From here on we will just keep on with that expectation of things coming out right and on top for these boys, and I have never allowed myself to feel otherwise.

Today we had some little additional information, the first in some weeks as regards to Roy. The Priest at her home town of Temple, Rev. Father O'Reilly called on Roy's wife yesterday with it seemed to be a little additional information.

He says that Roy is in Italy and he is of the opinion that he will be in position to assist in contacting Roy shortly.

We would presume that it comes through the Catholic church in Italy, or some representative body functioning out of that body of religion.

Seemingly, our local Red Cross offer very little to us just at the present, but we hope it will not be so long until both you and us will be able to in some way contact our boys.
