

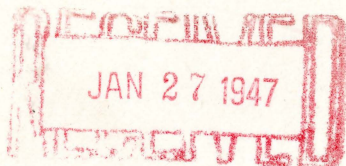

\$257,478 Bid Takes Airport Work Contract

City Manager Studies Navy Request to Lease Barracks for 10 Years

Contract for a 1,000-foot extension of the north-south runway at Municipal Airport was awarded by the City Council Wednesday to the Austin Road Company on its bid of \$257,478.

At the same time, City Manager Jones took under advisement for recommendation next week a request from the Navy Department for a 10-year lease on former naval barracks at Municipal Airport, but added that "certain plans" of the city might conflict with the Navy request.

Capt. E. E. Kerr of the 8th Naval District at New Orleans, said the buildings would be used as an armory for training naval reserves.

The council also:

Approved acquisition of \$16,000 worth of right-of-way in the Municipal Airport area.

Authorized \$39,137 worth of sanitary sewers to serve 235 homes in the Cowansville area.

Referred to Utilities Supervisor Howell a petition from 64 Oakhurst residents protesting a proposed loop in the bus line.

Authorized purchase of 11 lots, costing \$18,775, for the north-south expressway right-of-way.

Gave the Glade Construction Company a \$17,415 contract for sanitary sewers in Bluebonnet Hills and W. Oakhurst.
