


### City Manager Studies Navy Request to Lease Barracks for 10 Years

Contract for a 1,000-foot extension of the north-south runway at Municipal Airport was awarded by the City Council Wednesday to the Austin Road Company on its

bid of \$257,478.

At the same time, City Manager Jones took under advisement for recommendation next week a request from the Navy Department for a 10-year lease on former naval barracks at Municipal Airport, but added that "certain plans" of Royal Neighbors the city might conflict with the Navy request.
