NOVEMBER 30, 1952

Net profit (net of Federal taxes on income) previously reported in the amount of \$294,004 has been increased by \$50,535 for the month of November, 1951 and the net profit for the eleven months ended November 30, 1951 previously reported in the amount of \$11,054,092 has been reduced by \$186,084, after giving effect to adjustments made covering increases in Company contributions to the Retirement Benefit Plan, and in vacation, salary and wage accruals.
