So long as Amon G. Carter of Fort Worth "imbibed his booze" and kept his mouth shut it was all right with the Governor for him to serve on the board of Texas Tech. But when he "h'isted a stimulating decoction and yelled 'Hurrah for Dan Moody'," it is wrong and he has been asked to resign from the board. These are the developments which came to light in yesterday's papers. In the letter from Governor Ferguson to Mr. Carter, the former asserted that the Fort Worth publisher during the oil men's convention dispensed intoxicating beverages.
