It seems that day by day the trouble at the state Capitol grows worse and worse. Since the time that Attorney General, Dan Moody began his investigation of the State Highway Department, this has been the talk of the day. His efforts have resulted in the cancellation of several contracts, indictments filed against individuals and convictions in some cases.
