## TEXAS WANTS PROGRESS, NOT PERSONALITIES.

THE TIMES HERALD did not publish the contents of the demand of Governor Miriam A. Ferguson for the resignation of Amon G. Carter as chairman of the board of the Texas Technological College and Mr. Carter's refusal, as well as his statement to the public, because these communications dealt in personalities.

In the light of greater public affairs it was and is a private quarrel in which the public has no vital interest.

The Times Herald, not a supporter of Mrs. Ferguson or her talented husband, has in their cases, as well as all others, refrained from publishing personal attacks on them which invariably originate as the result of heated political controversies.

This is no time for personalities.

There is a great constructive work to do at Austin and we need the help of not only the governor, but all citizens who are willing to put personalities and enmities aside so that the tangled affairs of state can be viewed with clear and intelligent eyes.

The Times Herald, while it prides itself on never having supported Governor Ferguson, sincerely wishes her no harm or humiliation. This newspaper seeks the big facts in state affairs and not the small personal antagonisms such as are involved in the Carter case. We believe that Governor Ferguson can do more than any other person in bringing order out of chaos at Austin.

What The Times Herald hopes for from the pen of Mrs. Ferguson is not letters like the one she sent to Mr. Carter, her political antagonist, but a signed and sealed document calling a special session of the legislature.

What Texas wants now is progress, not personalities.
