PLIES TO LETTER REQUEST-ING RESIGNATION.

ORT WORTH, Dec. 1.—(AP).—

Amon G. Carter, chairman of he Board of Directors of the Texas echnological College, whose resgnation was requested Monday by Governor Miriam A. Ferguson, will ot accede to her request, he anounced in a formal letter to her and in a statement to the public ssued here this afternoon. The etter and statement deny all the charges made by the governor and declare that this is an effort on the part of the Fergusons to divert attention from the highway disclos-

Letter to Governor. The statement and the letter fol-

Governor Miriam A. Ferguson,

"Austin, Texas. 'Dear Governor:

"The charges contained in your etter published in the press of the state asking for my resignation as member of the Board of Directors of the Texas Technological college, are malicious and without ustification.

"The extreme conscientious sense of duty, which you so gallantly refer to with so much regret, is nothing more than a smoke screen to divert the mind of the public from the real issues. My appointment cas made by Covernor Neff for bur years, two of which I have ye of serve. I fully appreciate the reponsibility and dignity which naturally accompanies a position of urally accompanies a position or rust of this kind. The Texas Techological College has started out a real institution, capably manag I throughout and as chairman of s Board of Directors, I could not ountenance any confusion of side ne issues interfering with its rowth and development.

Sees Jim's Influence.

"I recall, as many others do, Governor Jim's activities with re-spect to our educational institu ions, especially the Texas Univerity and with the consequences of his actions in mind and their effect on the growth and development of these institutions, I seriously question the wisdom of your counsel, which, from your statement, is doubtless influenced by Governor "Administrations may come and

go, but these great institutions wil o on forever, and I feel the re-ponsibilities of those administering them should go directly to the people served by them and not to he particular administration which nappens to be in power. If there s one point on which the people of Texas are in accord, it is that our educational institutions should be divorced from politics. Under the circumstances I am compelled to decline to accede to your reques decline to accede to your request for my resignation. Meanwhile, if the Board of Directors, or the management of the Texas Technological College, or the people of Texas should feel that this institution would be benefitted by my resignation, I would gladly resign.
