No Special Session.

It was a wise decision Speaker Lee Satterwhite reached not to call a special session of the legislature at this time.

He announced his decision after long deliberation and much parleying.

It must be apparent to most people that a special session at this time would be a fruitless, aimless sort of affair. Not only that, but it would be an expensive luxury, and it could be fruitful of no lasting good. Moreover, it might impede or set at naught the plans of the attorney general for a thorough investigation of the highway department, and after all is said and done the attorney general is in better position to adjust those matters than a special session of the legislature would be.

It isn't necessary to be for or against the Fergusons to reach a decision on the futility of a special session. The question of pro-Fergusonism or anti-Fergusonism has little to do with a special session.

We can get along very well without a legislative session special or otherwise, for a few months at least. There is no general public clamor for it, and there is not likely to be one any time soon.
