Another Bunk Story

IN NEW YORK state and the east the New York Herald-Tribune is the great standpat republican newspaper. Its latest is that a democratic ticket consisting of Alfred E. Smith and Jesse Jones for vice president is the order of the hour in certain circles.

Jesse Jones, according to National Committeeman Jed Adams, landed the convention for Houston and deserves all the credit. Two years ago Jesse Jones' Texas friends were insisting that he announce as a candidate for United States senate, in 1928, as a contender for the seat of Earle B. Mayfield.

Now the great republican daily of New York and the eastern seaboard has Jesse slated for vice president on a ticket with Gov. Smith. More spotlighting, but not on the part of Jesse Jones.

Jesse is not only a man of action but a man of millions. He contributed a greater sum of money out of his own pocket to the John W. Davis campaign fund than any democrat in America.

But the New York Herald-Tribune did not land first. Amon G. Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram and the Fort Worth Record, won that distinction. Early in the month of January, after Houston had been named as the place, Publisher Carter declared for Jesse Jones for vice president.
