**AMON G. CARTER TELLS  
WHY HE RESIGNED**

Fort Worth, Texas.—The resignation of Amon G. Carter of Fort Worth as chairman of the board of directors of Texas Technological College, Lubbock, was announced here Saturday in a dispatch from Austin.

Mr. Carter was appointed by Governor Pat Neff four years ago to head the executive group of the new West Texas college.

"I have enjoyed my work and association with Dr. Horn, the members of the board, Mr. Freeland, the athletic director; the citizens of Lubbock and West Texas, and have a warm spot in my heart for this college and its future, and they can always depend on my support in every consistent way possible," Mr. Carter wrote in his letter of resignation to Governor Dan Moody.

"I find that during the coming year I am going to be away a good part of my time and it is almost physically impossible to devote as much time to this work as I really feel that the board is entitled to. Therefore, with sincere appreciation for my reappointment and the confidence you have bestowed on me, I must ask you to accept my resignation, to become effective at your earliest convenience."
