

Worth. Texas.-The resigna-Fort Worth, Texas.—The resigna-tion of Anion G. Carter of Fort Worth as chairman of the board of directors of Texas Tevhnological College, Lubbock, was announced here Saturday in a dispatch from Austin.

Mr. Carter was appointed by Govrnor Pat Neff four years ago to head he executive group of the new West 'exas college.

"I have enjoyed my work and asociation with Dr. Horn, the members of the board, Mr. Freeland, the athetic director; the citizens of Lubbock and West Texas, and have a warm spot in my heart for this college and its future, and they can always depend on my support in every consistent way possible," Mr. Carter wrote in his letter of resignation to Gover-

nor Dan Moody. "I find that during the coming year I am going to be away a good part of my time and it is almost physically impossible to devote as much time to this work as I really feel that the board is entitled to. Therefore, with sincere appreciation for my reappointment and the confidence you have bestowed on me, I must ask you to accept my resignation, to become effective at your earliest convenience."
