

White Favored in Abilene Golf

ABILENE, July 5. — Leonard White, Dallas dental laboratory technician, flatly disregarded par here Sunday in annihilating two opponents in the Abilene Country Club's invitation golf tournament. Needing 10 strokes less than the course standard for the distance he traveled, he won by decisive margins and established himself as the favorite over Corp. John Mazza of Camp Barkeley, whom he will meet in the 36-hole final Monday.

White, the meet medalist, opened his day by flailing Corp. Frank Stiedle of Camp Bowie, the defending champion, 7 and 5, in the morning quarterfinal. He came back at the same speed in the afternoon to dust off George Rollins of Stamford, 8 and 6.

Corporal Mazza of San Francisco, whose accomplishments have included shooting five holes-in-one and winning a club championship in his home city, also scored by a one-sided margin in the morning. His victim was Lt. John Allen, and the score was 9-7. Joe Bob White, another Dallas player, gave the corporal a lively argument in the semiwindup, however. Mazza was one down coming to the sixteenth hole, but he won three in a row for a two-up decision. He was two over par for the match. Results in the championship flight:
