Dear Folks:

Mr. Carter, who is out of the State at the present, has just received a letter from his son, Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., who is a prisoner of war in Germany and since he mentions Captain Donaho as having arrived at that camp and because I am sure Mr. Carter would want you to have the information as promptly as possible, I am taking the liberty of sending you, herewith, a photostatic copy of the letter.

As you will note the letter is dated August 26th and arrived yesterday, the 31st of October, which is the latest communication received from Amon Jr., although kin of other boys in the camp in Fort Worth have received mail dated as late as August 31st. In the event you have not already received word from the War Department this camp is located in the old Polish corridor about 100 miles South of Danzig and is near the Vistula river in a town called Schubin.

The senior officer of Oflag 64 was recently repatriated and spent several days with Mr. Carter in New York. The enclosed article carries an interview with Colonel Drake which might be of interest to you, and for fear you might not have seen it in Sundays Star-Telegram I am sending it along.

When you have finished with the letter, will you please return it to Mr. Carter and if there is any information about packages or letters we could give you or help in any way, it will be a pleasure as having gone through the anxious days we fully appreciate what a trying period it is to endure and realize what every bit of information means to you.
