ANCIENT PLIEBLOS

within the city limits of Globe lies Beshba-Gowah Indian ruins, the fascinating remains of a 200 room Salado Indian pueblo.

MOGOLLON RIM

(pronounced Mug-e-own) north of Globe lies the country of Zane Grey, its rugged grandeur and original beauty unscarred by the civilizing hand of man.

GHOST TOWNS

the staring fronts of McMillan, only 10 miles from Globe, whisper thrilling tales of silver, shooting and saloons to the imagination.

ARBORETUM

a geological wonderland of grotesque rock formations, dear to the hearts of amateur and professional "rock-hounds."

SALT RIVER CANYON

the "little" Grand Canyon a scenic wonder because of its colorful and rugged formations.



SAN CARLOS APACHES

the once fierce warriors who now, are peaceful expert cattlemen. But who have retained their tribal dances and ceremonials . . . pageants of primitive color and rhythm.

CLIFF DWELLINGS

the ancient homes of a vanished peoples, of the 12th century, whose civilization still breathes in the crumbling walls and broken pottery found in the cliffs near Globe.

FISHING

the churning fight of mountain trout . . or the placid joy of lake fishing for bass . . . you'll find them both in the streams and lakes around Globe.

HUNTING

amidst spectacular scenery in country that abounds in deer, elk, antelope, turkey, dove, quail and occasional bears and mountain lions.

APACHE TRAIL

MINING

silver began Globe's life and gave it its name (from a \$12,000 globe shaped hunk of silver ore) but today copper is the "life" of its industry, and Castle Dome with its steps of ore is a stairway of copper.
