Dearest Sallie

Your three welcome letter reached here Sunday night, finding me in a much better condition than yours previous to it. My health is still bad cannot stand studying, one night's study causes a pain for more than a day, do not know the cause, unless from too much and too constant study. Six three weeks since I stopped school, do not know whether I shall go any longer or no. We are having a very good meeting again had preaching Sunday and at night last night, and we are to have preaching again at night. Sunday was but a day of rejoicing among Christians. One of Satan's veterans old man Bradford made the good confession, as well as an other young lady, a relative of Mr. Gato, do not know her name. At night, Mary Andrews Sam, Howard, Fannie Shortridge, ^{the smallest of} Pickle, and Annie Tuttle, confessed the Saviour. Some of them as you know are rather young, I fear they do not sufficiently understand what is required of them. Last night John Dickerson and Paulina Smith came forward, and made the confession, much interest is manifested in the meeting, by all; do not know how long the meeting will continue.
