Aug. 17, 1869.

My Dear Sallie,

I am looking for the mail, which I hope will bring word from home, as it is now after 4 o'clock.

We commenced our meeting Saturday morning and have been preaching once a day and at night - up to this time. I preached Saturday morning and Sunday night, - Father Sunday morning & I Sunday night, - after which father gave an exhortation and fire came forward. Father preached yesterday morning and I at night - had one addition. I preached this morning had one confession. We have a house full at night - but not many in the day. A lively interest is manifested and I hope before the meeting closes many souls will be won to God. Father looks much better than he did when we left home. We are doing some of the biggest preaching that we ever done in life. Of course we have much opposition and some little interruptions. Miss Chesnohy is here, attends reg. regularly at night. see him turned loose on an excursion.
