the other 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> number.

I send four pr. of stockings for  
you, and three pr. for Jessie.  
They are very fine. I shall not



tell you what they cost, and  
then you cant tell any body else.

There is one pair of silk shoes, I  
think. Bro. Couch sends Addie  
a pair of excellent shoes, as a  
present. So he sends to sister  
the all linen collar. I send  
two collars each to you and  
sister. I send brother a watch-  
chain it is very nice.

Tell the other children that I  
will remember them when I  
come home. I am not so sure  
now that I will go to Uralde.  
I dont hear any thing more from  
them. Not a thing done here  
yet. I have not been very well  
for a few days - a little bilious.  
I took a dose of pills last  
night and am feeling better  
to day. I dont believe that  
I have given any of you  
a description of my trip to

the country. I will do so  
in my next to sister.

We are having meeting day and  
night this week. I expect to  
leave here next Friday, and go  
out to Bro. Wabwjo, and may  
stay over there till after Sunday.  
If so, I shall perhaps not go  
to Uralde.

I am doing so little good  
in this country, that I am  
becoming very much discouraged.  
I do hope that you all  
will sleep well.

Tell bro. Bell that I wrote  
him a long letter, which ought  
to have received several days  
before he was there inquiring  
for me.

May our good Father bless  
you all.
