Jesse turned the money over to brother Bowlin. No one has brought - us any wood yet I don't know what we are to do. The well has something dead in it - we can't drink the water, I have a barrel of rain water that we use. We have had such a nice rain this week, every thing is growing so fast - I will try to work in the garden some as soon as Tiny gets well enough.

Addie spends most of his time fishing, don't catch much either. I would not let him go so often but thinks maybe he will get - something. Jesse say the schoolmous are finding fault with Mr. Thomas. He thinks with out - any cause, there has not - but - one said. Jesse says he is afraid the boys won't get anything. The Douglasses and several others have settled with Randolph. I got my plants last Sunday, they were nearly all dead. I think may be two or three of these will live. There are so many children around that I will have to stop writing. I don't know what I have written he want - to hear from you as often as you have time to write. With much love I remain your
