My Dear Addison

I believe they say it is my time to write. The children have gone to meeting I could not go baby has been funny since Friday night. I think there is another tooth coming. The rest are all well and talk of nothing else but our trip. Geo Sister and I will have to get pulsters, and a basket dont expect there are any baskets here. Will see tomorrow Mother says she is ready any time. Miss Mattie Stone writes me that she will be here on the 1st of August. I fear she will hinder me considerably. for I still have a good deal to do. I would have been glad if she had waited until after we were gone. The children are having a time getting string. Charlie is crying now at the top of as loud as he can. from an ant string on the tree. one string him yesterday on

the thumb and it was an hour before it was
easy, a wash string hoister on the fore head
just before dinner his eye are swollen from it I know
he did not feel much like going to meeting but
he did not think of staying away.

Sister Carothers stopped in awhile this evening
mother was not out this evening I fear she
is not well, I must hurry, the children
are going to the Spring to get water for the
baby, and I want to send this to the
office. We all want to see you very
much. Yemaise is sitting on the floor with
paper and pencil says she is writing papa
a letter Good bye. Children send love,
