
Sometime ago, you were good enough to send the writer a letter in reference to the little incident which occurred at College Station during the A. & M. and Texas football game and I hope you will accept my apology for not acknowledging this letter sooner.

Meanwhile, I have received several hundred letters and telegrams and it has been a real pleasure to have received the friendly support on this matter, as out of the entire list there have only been four or five of a dissenting voice.

We have not published any of these letters or telegrams as I had no desire to use my connection with the paper for the purpose of carrying on a personal controversy with the Governors. Then, again, I had no desire to provoke any kind of a controversy that would divert the minds of the public from the real issue.
