Dear Mr. Carter, This letter may come as a surprise, but I know Amos Jr. will be pleased that I am writing. You will have got over the disappointment of his being made a P.O.W., but my assurances that he is able to care for himself will come as a great encouragement to you & form a message of goodwill for Christmas, I hope. We were in the same ward when Junior had a spell of jaundice. We found we had much in common & he has promised to visit me ~~at~~ my house in the country when happier times return for us all. Before he moved to his new camp, he had recovered fully, was in tremendous spirits, & had an important Camp appointment, - that of Parcel's Officer, which he was filling extraordinarily well. When you write to him, please give him my remembrances. Our plans for after the War will doubtless amuse you. Amos was to visit England & I was to show him the historic places in which he was obviously keenly interested, whereas I had to visit the States and do a lecture tour! It seems we belong to similar fraternal organisations, so that all seemed set for a pleasant & friendly reunion when peace returns. I am in Education, with journalistic connections - Horticulture being my hobby & Amos is, I hope, coming to see my gardens one day. Our experiences are, perhaps, bitter, but I do assure all of you who love him, that they will have a refining & manly influence on the right fellows, - and Amos is one of those.
