Dear Mrs. Gunn:

The New York Times carried the story of Stanley's injury and I was happy at the time as it looked like he would be OK(PERIOD) However this morning my office informed me of the final news of Stanley's death(PERIOD) It is an unfortunate tragedy and my heart goes out to you in the deepest sympathy possible (PERIOD) I only wish there was something I could do or say to lessen your sorrow (PERIOD) Stanley was a fine upright courageous capable good American doing a grand job in keeping the Mothers and wives at home advised of the doings of their loved ones in the Pacific (PERIOD) The percentage of casualties is small compared to the enormity of the campaign but in your case it was unfortunately one hundred percent (PERIOD) Stanley loved his work and did not hesitate to go where the activities were the greatest and necessarily the dangers in keeping with the occasion.(PERIOD) I am sure all the interested readers of Stanley's war dispatches join me in sincerest sympathy and the feeling that you will be as brave and courageous as possible in facing your great loss.
