Relief to Prisoners of War,
American Red Cross,
Washington, D. C.

Received a letter dated September 28th from my son, Lt. Amon G. Carter, Junior, Prisoner of War Number 1595, Oflag 64, Germany, as follows:

Quote Have had no letter from anyone in a month and no parcels in three months and I don't expect any more. One hundred more officers due here and that will make three hundred with no U. S. overcoats or blankets.

Cannot understand why the Red Cross isn't sending anything. We haven't seen their representative in five and one-half months. In two weeks we were out of food parcels Unquote I realize that you are operating under difficulties in Germany at this time. Meanwhile, is there not some way you can possibly get overcoats, blankets and food to these boys. If you remember, half of the other prisoners of war in this camp did not receive their overcoats last Fall until December 13. If the prisoners of war at this and other camps do not receive Red Cross parcels, they cannot exist. I am sure you are doing everything you can and hope you will get relief to them immediately.
