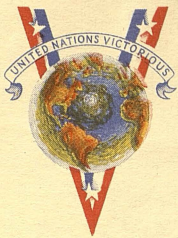


Paris
5 February 1943

Dear Mr Carter:

Navy Captain Harry Butcher was back in his office today after an illness with a severe bronchial cold, and he was graciously cordial. He inquired immediately about you and was particularly interested in the likelihood that the camp where Simon J. has been a prisoner probably has been overrun by the Russian advance. He said the American military mission in Moscow undoubtedly is watching that situation closely

and he has no doubt
you will be notified quickly
of any favorable developments.

He has promised to help me
get an appointment with General
Eisenhower when he returns to Paris
within a few weeks from the Third
Army, and said, "Tell Anson I
don't know when I'll have an
opportunity to write a personal
letter to him, because the work
has stacked up while I've been
ill — but he will hear from
me."
