Dear Miss Deakins:

Am pleased to advise that we have received a letter from the Office of The Provost Marshal General advising that inasmuch as the price of ROBT. BURNS Panatela de Luxe and ROBT. BURNS Perfecto Grande is identical, it will be entirely satisfactory to them if we substitute the ROBT. BURNS Perfecto Grande size when we make this shipment of cigars referred to in your letter of March 16th, for which we have already received Mr. Carter's check in the sum of \$12.24.

In your letter you state that you are enclosing War Department labels for 200 cigars and you did enclose two of these labels. However, wish to advise that at the suggestion of the Provost Marshal General we are now accepting orders for either one or two units, therefore, you are permitted to order either 100 or 200 cigars against every Prisoner of War mailing label.

Have, therefore, given instructions to have 200 ROBT. BURNS Perfecto Grande cigars sent to Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr., using only one of the labels sent with your letter and am returning to you herewith the other unused label as possibly you might wish to use it for some other product.

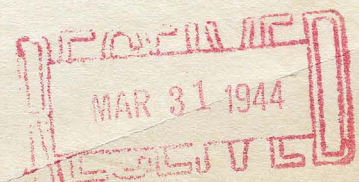
The package of 200 ROBT. BURNS cigars is now on the way to the post office for Lt. Carter and do hope that it will be received in good order and without too much delay.
