Dear Mr. Best:

It seems the War Department is changing their routine of sending the "next-of-kin" labels for food and cigar packages and are going to stagger the shipping dates instead of sending all of them out on the 10th of the month every two months.

Therefore, enclosed you will find tobacco labels for Amos Junior and since two food lists and no tobacco list was enclosed, I cannot send it along to you. I presume the No. is the same but for fear it isn't I have not listed it on the shipping label. Our last list shows the item as No. 78 and please ship ROBT. BURNS Perfecto Grande cigars, for which a check in the amount of \$24.48 is enclosed.

Incidentally, the writer was out of the office when the last shipment was sent you in May, which explains the error in Mr. Carter affixing his signature on the labels.

The labels have to be used before August 17. So, please ship them out as soon as possible in two packages - 200 cigars to each package.
