many, where he started nearly two years ago, but not like he intended to get there. He writes that he is in a German Prison Camp, after being captured in Tunisia in a tank he was driving when the Americans had a little setback in the early stages of the Tunisian battle. The letter passed by the German censors mentioned several items that he could use if his parents would send them through Red Cross and they are planning sending him a package as soon as it can be cleared. He has not been reported in prison camp yet by the U. S. War Department.
