When I returned to the city, I found your letter of November 13th expressing a wish to have a set of the pictures sent to me by Lt. Meadow of Alabama so that you might learn whether or not your husband appears in them. I am very happy to enclose herewith a set of the pictures and you may keep them in the event your husband is in them, otherwise I would appreciate your returning them as I have been trying to send sets to the next of kin of the boys that I know in the pictures.

I am also sending a copy of Lt. Meadow's letter to me as well as a copy of the notations on the back of the originals which I received. You will note that the pictures were taken in January 1944.

My last letter from Mason was dated August 26th and arrived here a little more than two weeks ago. He seemed in particularly good spirits. Mrs. Barron of Waco called at my office a few days ago and showed me a letter she had received from her husband dated September 3rd and she thought his letter very optimistic and cheerful.

For fear you might not have seen it, enclosed you will find an article which appeared in the Star-Telegram about ten days ago carrying an interview with Col. Drake, senior officer of Oflag 64, who was recently repatriated. He spent three days with me in New York and so that the families of the boys in Oflag 64 might have the latest information I asked him to give an interview to the Star-Telegram which I felt would be of interest to everyone.

I am glad to hear from you anytime and interested in anything you hear from your husband,
