Am sure you too had received labels from government for regular packages from nearest of kin, for Aflong 64 address. We are preparing a box now to send Roy J at the Aflong 64 address, trusting the proper postal, Red Cross (or whomever) authorities, will know of this change of camp address - I am continuing to write to him too at same address, Am

Too hopeful or optimistic?

My! how quickly the letter came to the woman in Buffalo!

Dated, January eighteenth!

She, like you, have been receiving mail dated October, November, and a letter came to her Saturday dated November.

We shall appreciate any further information, should you receive it. With renewed hope that we shall hear soon, directly from our boys, as we pray for their safety.
