Dear Mr. Cheatham:

In reply to your letter of March 25, permit me to advise that I have neither heard from nor about Amon Junior although any number of Texas people have received official notice that their boys from Oflag 64 had been liberated. In fact, this morning I received a telephone call from Dublin, Texas that a Mrs. Yardley had just received a letter from her son direct, written March 11, posted the 20th and arrived there the 26th, although she had no official notice that he had been liberated.

Lt. Bill Everett of Sweetwater, Texas who came over with Lt. Colley and Captain Gruenberg, among the first eight to reach this country, spent the night with me last night. However, he could give me no information beyond that of the first night after the first day of their march upon evacuating the camp. So all we can do is to be patient and hope and pray that we will soon hear from all of the boys.
