Associated Press carried statement morning paper from London by Sir James Grigg, British War Secretary, advising that members of Oflag 64 transferred to Oflag 13-B at Hammelburg PERICD Have you any information confirming this? We have had indications that the camp may have been divided. If so part of the members could be in Luckenwalde and part in Hammelburg PERIOD My son, Amon G. Carter, Jr., being a prisoner of war in Oflag 6/2 I am anxious to have all available information regardless of cost and expense. Please answer collect. Thanks.
