Dear Mrs. Emerson:

Please accept my thanks and appreciation for your letter of September 17th enclosing your letter of August 7th from your husband who is interned in the same prisoner of war camp as my son, Amon Junior.

The last letter I received from Amon Junior was dated June 12th; however a friend of his in Dallas received a letter from him dated July 27th and at that time he told of celebrating the first anniversary of the camp on June 6th and said they had a grand celebration in "more ways than one" which indicated they knew of D-Day.

I enjoyed reading Captain Emerson's letter and think he very cleverly told you of the possibility of their moving which I have felt would happen if the activities came too close to the camp. Incidentally, Larry Allen, a newspaper correspondent, who was repatriated from Oflag 64, indicated that if these boys were moved they thought it would be into the mountains on the border near Switzerland.

Your letter is returned, herewith, and anytime you have any news I would appreciate your getting in touch with me or my office and I, likewise, will pass on any information we get from Amon Junior.
