Receipt is acknowledged of one package label and two tobacco labels addressed to Oflag 9 A/Z, Germany.

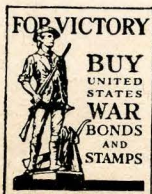
One package label and two tobacco labels addressed to Oflag 64, Germany, are inclosed.
