Dear Mrs. Welch:

Your letter of May 15 has been received. Mr. Carter does wish to continue these orders, and I am enclosing herewith his check in the amount of \$25.00 to cover the cost of the food parcels which he has sent to his son, Amon Junior, every 60 days.

Also enclosed you will find the next-of-kin label from the War Department authorizing an eleven pound package to be sent to:

any time between May 11 and July 10, 1944. Will you please use this label to send your \$5.00 food parcel containing a 100 day supply of Vita Kap Improved tablets. In a letter from Mr. Carter's son dated April 5, he writes, "In each parcel please put 2 cans of Nescafe & cheese. Leave it in the can because they come through the censors okay." In another letter he asks us to send some Scottish tissue, black pepper, and matches if possible.

Under separate cover we are sending some Scottish tissue, shaving soap, and a pipe holder, which we hope you can include in this package. We are wondering if you could send the Nescafe, cheese and black pepper which Amon Junior has requested. If you cannot include the articles we are sending, would you please return them to Mr. Carter.
