Enclosed you will find next-of-kin  
label addressed to:

2nd Lt. Amon G. Carter, Jr.,  
U. S. Prisoner of War #1595,  
Interned in Oflag 64, Germany,  
Via New York, N. Y., USA.

as Mr. Carter would appreciate your sending the  
11 pound food parcel to his son under this label.  
Under separate cover he is sending you  $1\frac{1}{2}$  pounds  
(6 packages) of sweet chocolate to be included  
in the package and he would also appreciate your  
including the following items:

Bouillon Cubes - beef	1/4 Lb
Powdered Milk	1 "
Instant Coffee	1/2 "
Granulated Sugar	1/2 Lb
Ovaltine	1 "
Banana Flakes	1/4 "
Jello Butterscotch Pudding	
H. O. Quick Cooking Oat Meal	
Raisins	1 lb
Kraft Dinner	

The following are optional as to amounts and the  
number of items you may be able to get into the  
package:

Toilet Paper  
Spaghetti Sauce  
Muellers Macaroni  
Sauce-Kwick (dried Apples)  
Bisquick  
Razor Blades  
Chewing Gum  
Tomato Powder

Just put the most concentrated and least bulky food possible into the package and get it off as promptly as possible.

I think I wrote you that the last package he received from your organization was solidified so use as many push in tins and cellophane as possible.

Enclosed you will find Mr. Carter's check for \$20.00 and please advise after you have shipped this package what his credit balance is for he wants to keep a balance and to have you send packages as often as is permitted that don't require next of kin labels.
