Dear Mrs. Deakins:-

Thank you so much for your check, permit label, and food order to be sent to Lt. Carter. We will pack him a fine box including as many of the things you have suggested as we can to make up the allowed eleven pounds.

In answer to your statement that the last package Lt. Carter received was solidified I wonder if you know that this does not hurt the flavor, food value, or substance of the articles. We pack the ovaltine, tomatoe, milk, and other powders in two cellophane bags and one paper one. We experimented with a number of these bags in our shop window where we kept them for over a month in the summer and on taking them out, though they were hard, they responded to the directions for their use and had lost nothing, as I said, in either flavor or food value.

As soon as we receive the chocolate we will pack your box and a complete list of its contents together with the cost will be sent to you.
