Dear Mr. Carter:-

I had a most interesting letter this morning from General McQuillin in which he enclosed your letter of April 15 and the photostat of the prisoner-of-war letter from your son.

Our community of interest lies in the fact that my son, Lieut. Kenneth H. Goddard, was Aide to General Mc Quillin and was taken prisoner in Africa by the Germans on February 14, 1943, the day your son was isolated on the top of Mt. Lassouda.

Both your boy and mine are interned at Oflag 64, in Poland.

We hear from Kenneth about once a month and while I gather that they are suffering no great physical hard-ships I can readily understand the mental punishment that they are taking.

Fifteen months is a long time to take out of a young man's life but, the way things are going now, I think we can feel that it will not be long before we will have them back home with us again.
