You have no doubt heard that Graham has been "missing in action in France since Nov. 13th.

We believe that he is a German prisoner and that he has been stationed in a prison camp at Neubrandenburg, Germany. We got this much information in a round about way.

It is our understanding that Mr. Amon G. Carter's son, an officer, was carried to the same prison camp.

If you can contact Mr. Carter about the matter and have him use his influence to find out some information about our boy, we will be very grateful.

We have not been informed a thing by the War Department and the International Red Cross seems to rate a double zero, too, as far as their interest in the matter is concerned.

We are told that it takes influence and pull to obtain any information even about our sons who have offered their lives. This may, or may not be true, but that is the way that it looks to us. The War Department does not seem to care whether we have any news of them or not.

I have a nice store and a nice drug business here at home and I should have done this years ago, I guess.

Hope that you and Thetis and all of you are well and happy. I trust t you will not find it too difficult to contact Mr. Carter. We feel th with our three " in there" besides Doug, our son-in-law, that we should be entitled to a little consideration from those "desk soldiers" in Was ington, who are supposed to attend to such matters.
