Dear Mr. Carter:

Please pardon my tardiness in communicating with you since our last telephone conversation but it is only since reaching my home here in Carmel that I have been able to settle down and accomplish anything.

I was disappointed not to have been able to come through Fort Worth but unfortunately the air transportation arranged for me by the ATC routed me a different way. However, there is a possibility that I will be going East within the next week or two and I will certainly make every effort to stop off in Fort Worth.

You are no doubt better acquainted than I am with the present situation of our prisoners in Poland and Germany. From radio and newspaper reports the Russians have been able to liberate quite a number of our people and I certainly hope that you have received word that Amon is among those now on their way to Moscow and freedom.

As I mentioned in one of our telephone conversations I am endeavoring to get a temporary assignment with SHAF to assist in the evacuation of our prisoners liberated by the Russian advance and also those who will not be liberated until the termination of the war. So far nothing definite has yet come of it but have hopes.

Incidentally the young lady from your Washington bureau called on me at Walter Reed Hospital and I gave her such information as I could concerning the camp and Amon. If you were able to use any of her release I should appreciate receiving a copy to see what ^{she} wrote.
