Dear Colonel Hoskot:

Your letter of February 25 was received some time ago and I appreciated the interview you gave the young lady of our Washington Bureau; however, inasmuch as it concerned mostly Amon Junior, we did not carry it in the paper as I was anxious to have general information concerning all of the boys in the camp. Naturally, I enjoyed that part concerning Amon Junior, however I felt it would be somewhat embarrassing not to have information on others in the camp.

I have hoped from day to day that word would come from or about Amon, however there has been nothing other than word through Lt. Col. Hal Jones Jr. of Austin that Amon Junior was with him, in his card of February 7 from Luckenwalde at Stalag III-A. Every day we hear from some family that their son or husband has been released; however from bits of information from various families whose boys are in Oflag 64 they have evidently split up and part of them are at Oflag 13 B, Hammelburg at Parchim and at Luckenwalde.
