Dear Mrs. Irvin:

Your letter of October 16th received and a set of the pictures received from Oflag 64 Germany, is enclosed, herewith. These pictures were taken in January 1944 and we have tried to get in touch with all the families of the boys Amon Junior had mentioned in his letters up to that time. Of course the pictures arrived only a week ago but if your husband is in the pictures, Mr. Carter would be very glad for you to have a set of them. If not, will you be good enough to return them so they can be furnished to someone who has kin in the groups.

Amon Junior does not appear in any of the scenes of the funeral service of Captain Richard Torrence and we are inclined to think he might have taken the pictures. Mr. Carter is out of the state or he would have written you personally.

The Senior officer of Oflag 64 has just arrived in the U.S. and gotten in touch with Mr. Carter. He told Mr. Carter there had been quite a lot of rumors and talk that they would be moved however he had received information that the order had been rescinded and that in all probability the boys would remain at their present location until the war is over.

Amon Junior's sister received a letter yesterday dated August 13th and the writer received a card two weeks ago dated August 24th which is the latest we have had. Everything seemed to be fine and they were getting along all right.

It was nice of you to have written and I hope you find your husband in some of the pictures.
