the War Depart-ment in April, has arrived in a Ger-man prison camp, according to word received Friday by his mother. While no official report of his capture has reached Dallas,

the message that Captain Fiel-FIELSCHMIDT. schmidt is a pris-oner of war came in a letter from Lt. Amon Carter Jr. to his father, Amon Carter, Fort Worth newspaper publisher.

In his letter from a German camp where he also is a prisoner, Lieu-tenant Carter reported that the Dallas captain and 100 other of-ficers had reached his camp on April 23. He wrote that all the newly arrived prisoners were in good physical condition.

Captain Fielschmidt was a prac-ticing dentist here before receiving his commission in the Army Dental Corps March 10, 1941. He has been overseas two years. His wife lives in Boston, Mass.
