Dear Mr. Culver:

Thank you for your recent letter about some Cine-Kodak Film for Lt. Amon Carter, Jr. of pictures taken in Africa. While we have made a preliminary check of our records without success, we believe more information would be required before we can make a very thorough search for the pictures in question.

It would be essential to know the exact size and type of film Lt. Carter used, an exact mailing date when the film was forwarded from Africa, the number of rolls, and the address he gave at the time of mailing.

Also, whenever a return address is left off film packages, or becomes unclear on the way, these pictures are entered on our unidentified film files. To check this possibility we must know the exact type of scenes or subjects Lt. Carter made.

As we are eager to do everything possible to help you account for the film in question, we shall be glad to have you write again if we may be of further assistance.
