yet I haven't had any word from her.
This form I have also gives way of
writing prisoners in Germany if you'd
like to have it I'll gladly send it to
you.

Hoping you'll have good news soon.
My Prayers are that this terrible war
will be over soon so our loved ones
can come home again.
