Dear Mrs. Carter,

Houston forwarded your letter and enclosures on to me here at the ranch. We certainly do wish to thank you most sincerely for your kindness and consideration. It was greatly appreciated.

We had a telegram on the 8th that Bobby was a prisoner of war interned at Stalag Luft - three - Germany, also his navigator Lt. Nash and Lt. White - White being reported as wounded. Lt. White was the bombardier. We have, thus far, not been able to hear concerning the co-pilot Lt. Jasineck or the rest of the crew. I believe, though, they were saved as they should have had a better chance of getting out than the pilots, navigator and bombardier.

I haven't heard yet from the

Provost Marshal General, by letter, let people
to hear in the next day or so, from them
giving his prisoner number so that we may
write - and also enclosing a "label" so we
can get off a package.

and thank you in person for your kind-
